!Trigger warning! This task (and the course) involves discussion/ description of violent crimes and other traumatic life events.

Studying criminology will involve examining the different criminological theories that have been developed to explain why some individuals commit crime whereas others do not. Several of these explanations fall either side of the 'nature vs. nurture' debate. You need to know what aspects of a person either side of this debate focuses on.

Research skills are an essential part of the criminology course We will be starting with Unit 1 which includes analysing different types of crime. Your task is to research the following different types of crime;

- 1. White collar crime e.g. organised crime
- 2. Moral Crime e.g. assisted suicide
- State Crime e.g. war crimes
- 4. Technological crime e.g. e-crime
- 5. Individual crime e.g. hate crime

For each of the 5 types you should;

- 1. Find out how common it is in the UK.
- 2. Find a case/ example of each and describe it in detail.

Challenge task: research reasons why crimes might go unreported and contribute to the 'dark figure of crime'.

Review those two choices to show why you would be interested or suitable for that career.
