Building on your knowledge of Spanish grammar is very important as this forms the foundations of accurate spoken and written Spanish.

You need to know how to conjugate regular and irregular verbs in various tenses: present, imperfect, preterit, perfect, future and conditional.

Create a presentation/guide that explains how to conjugate regular –AR, -ER and –IR verbs in these six tenses and when to use the tenses. To show your understanding of when to use these different tenses, you might need to do some research.

You also need to know how to conjugate the main irregular verbs in Spanish. Create verb tables of the six tenses for the following verbs (see example for present tense of SER):

- SER
- ESTARIR
- IR
 IIA
- HACERTENER
- ILNER

It is really important to keep up to date with current news in Spain. You can look at newspapers online on the following sites: <u>www.elpais.com</u> and <u>www.bbc.com/mundo</u>.

Choose an article from one of these sites and make a note of any Spanish vocabulary you do not know. Write a short summary in English of what the article is about which someone else would understand if they had never read the original article. This is called a native reader/speaker check.
