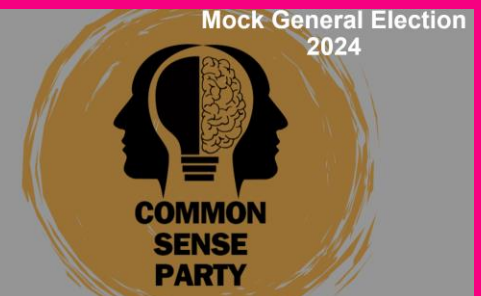
## PROM

## STUDENT GENERAL ELECTION

On July 4<sup>th</sup> MV16 students took part in a mock general election. Students had been preparing for this since the election was announced, by coming up with their own parties or supporting one of the main UK ones. More than 20 students were involved in the election process, from creating posters and campaign slides to promoting their manifesto promises, to planning and filming a short video where they appealed to the voting public. Individuals and groups also promoted their policies around the college building. Voting took place via teams and the result was announced the next day with a new and unique group, the Common-Sense party, winning, closely followed by the representatives from the Green Party. Students have come away from this event with not only a greater political understanding but have also developed organisation, team work and time keeping skills.





## BAFTA

On Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> July, MV media and English students had the opportunity to meet and network with BAFTA award winning screenwriter Michelle Lipton. Michelle is a local talent who has been a professional writer for over a decade. Michelle is currently a core writer on both *Holby City* and *Casualty* having previously been on the writing teams of *Doctors*, *Hollyoakes* and CBBC'S BAFTA-nominated *Rocket's Island*. She has written and developed original television drama series for BBC Studios, Leopard, Hat Trick, Red Productions, CBBC and Machine.

"How Michelle Lipton wrote these episodes comes across like she's written eight plays, taken from so many points of view," he added. "I don't think there's another writer who could have done it."

MV students took part in a seminar with Michelle and asked about the realities of making a living in screenwriting.



## WORK EXPERIENCE

In June, over 190 of our year 12 students completed 'in-person' work experience placements which they had successfully secured for themselves. We have received impressive employer feedback and many employers are happy to take future MV students. Thank you to parents who were able to support through their own contacts. A further 30 students completed 'virtual' work experience through the Springpod platform in college. Work experience is a vital part of our careers programme and we encourage all students to access the Springpod platform over their summer break.



## ART EXHIBITION

On July 9<sup>th</sup> we had a wonderful evening celebrating the hard work and talents of our year 13 creative cohort. Friends, family and members of the local community gathered together to view the fantastic and varied work of Art, Photography, Graphics, Textiles, Product Design and Media Studies.
