UCAS applications

UCAS application season is once again underway at MV with all of the early applications sent off ahead of the 15th October deadline. The next important deadline for UCAS is for students to submit their draft personal statements to their referee via Unifrog by 28th October. This helps us to meet the UCAS 31st January deadline as we expect to send off over 160 applications this year. Students have been fully briefed on the process we follow at MV and they will find support documents in their Unifrog Teacher Locker. All students who are busy researching Higher/Degree Apprenticeship opportunities can access support from Mrs Parks and we highly recommend they also submit a UCAS application as a Plan B!

Student ambassadors


